







Extracurricular Clubs Policy


Definition of School Extracurricular Clubs:

Steps for Establishing Extracurricular Clubs

The establishment of extracurricular clubs involves several steps, including:


- 1. Proposing a name for the club.
- 2. Drafting the rationale for establishment.
- 3. Formulating objectives.
- 4. Presenting the club project to the school administration.
- 5. Opening a call for volunteers.
- 6. Holding an initial meeting to establish the club.
- 7. Preparing an annual record.
- 8. Conducting meetings under the supervision of a faculty advisor.
